

Practice facilities

On Saturday (6/17), we will set up the dojo in the spacious Sports and Activities Center (help is always needed and greatly appreciated). Once again, we will practice on Zebra tatami mats which can be purchased at a savings after camp. (Please let us know as soon as possible if you are interested in purchasing mats.) The dojo is a short walk from the University Apartments, where we will be housed.

Lodging

Each air-conditioned apartment has four bedrooms, two bathrooms, a living room, and a kitchen with a stove and refrigerator. Most bedrooms are double occupancy. The University will supply a blanket, pillow, bed linen, and two towels for the week. There are laundry facilities for people staying in the apartments.

Meals

Meal service begins with breakfast on Sunday (6/18), then three meals per day until lunch on Saturday (6/24).

Schedule

People who train in Seki Shihan's classes are amazed by the amount of personal attention he gives to students on the mat and the number of classes he offers each day. In addition to exceptional Aikido training led by Seki Shihan and other instructors throughout the day, a variety of activities is planned for the evening hours including: special Aikido training for instructors only, Question-and-Answer sessions, weapons classes, the MAF delegates' meeting, and the annual Friday night party.

Registration

Participation is limited to adults (18 or over). Please complete the enclosed Summer Camp application and send it, along with your **deposit**, to MAF Summer Camp 2006, c/o Naomi Wentworth, 2153 W Waveland Ave, Chicago, IL 60618 by April 8, 2006. Your deposit will hold a place for you until we receive the **balance** of your payment, due by May 8th. Applications received after May 8th can be accepted only if space is available and will be assessed a \$50 late fee.

Refunds

A \$50 handling fee will be deducted from deposits for cancellations received prior to May 8th. Refund requests received after May 8th cannot be guaranteed.

AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE FOR INJURIES

The Midwest Aikido Federation (hereafter called the "MAF"), its members, guest instructors, or anyone else, are unwilling to have people practice Aikido during the 2006 Midwest Aikido Federation Summer Camp if the MAF, its members, or visiting instructors, or anyone else, might be sued for injuries that may happen to anyone while practicing at the Summer Camp or for injuries that could occur, for any reason, anywhere on the Premises (the University of Wisconsin-Parkside), or on the way to or from Summer Camp.

Therefore, we ask, in consideration and exchange for allowing you to practice at the 2006 Midwest Aikido Federation Summer Camp and other good and valuable consideration, the legal sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, that you sign this document and by doing so give up any rights you may have to sue or hold the MAF, its members, or guest instructors, or anyone else, liable for any injuries which may occur to you caused by negligence or any other reason, while anywhere on the Premises, including while on the mat and including on the way to or from the Summer Camp.

I, the undersigned applicant to the Midwest Aikido Federation Summer Camp, understand and acknowledge that I am applying for instruction in Aikido, a martial art involving strenuous exercise and body contact. I further understand and acknowledge that the MAF carries no insurance against injury to any of its students during the 2006 MAF Summer Camp. I have carefully read this document and understand it and in consideration and exchange for practicing Aikido at the 2006 Midwest Aikido Federation Summer Camp held from June 17 through June 24, 2006, and in further consideration as more fully stated above, give up any rights I may have to sue or hold liable the MAF, its members, or guest instructors, or anyone else, for any injuries that may occur to me while practicing Aikido during the 2006 Midwest Aikido Federation Summer Camp or while anywhere on the Premises or while going to or from the Summer Camp.
